

Originating from Russia, the Haskap (a member of the Honeysuckle family) was introduced to Canada through the efforts and research at the University of Saskatchewan. An extremely winter hardy plant, perfect for our Canadian backyards and orchards. A great new addition to your garden and diet. Be sure to try this delicious berry!

- Exceptional hardiness to -40°. Even flowers can handle exposure to -7°. (Zones 2-8)
- Earliest picking fruit (mid-June) even before strawberries!
- Seedlings planted this spring will produce fruit this fall!
- Great for organic gardening!
- Cross pollination required. Be sure to plant 2-3 different varieties in close proximity to ensure pollinization by bees. Excellent taste experience! Flavours of blueberry, raspberry, blackberry, or even cherry ... with a kiwi like texture, a truly unique flavour.
- Yellow-white flowers in summer turn to deep bluish-purple ½ inch 1" oblong berries.
- Round shrub with dark green foliage, growing 4-6 feet tall.
- Plant in full sun. Easy pruning just remove older branches in late winter/early spring.
- Disease resistant, but attracts birds.
- High levels of anti-oxidants, flavonoids and vitamin C offering many health benefits, including prevention of cancer and heart disease.
- Ideal for eating fresh, desserts, jams, wine, health beverages, frozen or preserved.
