Having problems with deer in the garden? You're not alone. The number one gardening issue across Canada is four legged and able to clear 8 foot fences.

You want to enjoy and relax in your gorgeous surroundings and signs of deer nipping at your tender garden plants can tug at the heartstrings. After all, you've made an investment, put in a lot of effort and time to grow a beautiful garden and seeing deer treat your garden like a buffet line can be frustrating.

There are many physical deterrents you can use to defend the garden such as fences (solid and electrical), noises (radios and ultrasonic emitters), or smell and taste repellents (soap and hair). While they all offer a solution, they can be expensive to maintain.

A great alternative is to plant deer-resistant perennials. Selecting perennials that deer naturally find distasteful encourages them to turn away. Plant deer-resistant perennials in the more sensitive areas of your garden, such as along the property edges, or around the vegetable garden to outsmart and divert them.

Deer will eat almost anything if they are hungry enough and no plant is 100% deer-proof, so after tasting the less appetizing varieties in your garden, they will travel...perhaps on over to your neighbor's unprotected veggies.
