# saskatoon berry

Saskatoon berries look much like blueberries, but are more closely related to the apple family.

They are a wonderful sweet berry, having a slight nutty flavour.

- Harvest time of late June to July
- Adaptable to many growing climates, from sea level to mountain peaks.
- Bushes can grow up to 16ft (4.8m) in height
- Self-pollinating berry that fruits for 30+ years!
- Also known as Prairie Berry, Juneberry and Serviceberry
- Mature bushes produce white flowers each spring.
- Bushes provide a nice heavy yield of berries!
- Bushes are shade tolerant, but produce larger yields with more direct sunlight
- Are an excellent source of iron, magnesium, potassium, calcium, and are high in anti-oxidants!
- Ideal for eating fresh, in desserts, jams, frozen or preserved

Colour	Purple/Red Blue
Uses	Fresh Eating & Processing
Height	4.8 m (16 ft.)
Fruit Size	Small, size of a blueberry
Harvest	Late June-July
Characteristics	Berries look like blueberries, though they are cousins with apples.
